PERFORMANCE-CUM-ACHIEVEMENT REPORT

The Table Tennis is one of the sports event among Deaf in which we have achieved international standards and India has participated in Deaflympic and Asia-Pacific Games in the past over the years and the same has drawn up appreciation in various medias. As much as we had a line-up of talented and experienced players, most of whom have now become veterans, our hunt for highly talented youngsters have gained momentum to continue our potentials. The medal winning habit has been a reward for all of us for regular organizing competitions at various levels. Here our state affiliated bodies deserve highly commendable praises. Having won medals to date, we now have the added responsibility to keep on winning spree and our preparation for next deaflympics and International Individual Championships have started in right earnest manner with the holding of 16th National Deaf Table Tennis championship at Chandigarh during December, 2009.

Around 120 Table Tennis players from all over India, in Men, Women, Jr. Boys, Sub Jr. Boys / Girls groups and officials representing Delhi, Kerala, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab, UP, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh and Bihar, has took part in the championship.

The championship in Opening and Closing Ceremonies were inaugurated by a well known distinguished Chief Guest Mr. P.K. Sharma, Additional Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, inaugurated the championship on 11th December 2009 at the premises of Govt. Table Tennis Hall in a glittering colourful function with well attended by Guests, players, veterans, officials, office bearers and EB members of AISCD and its state organizations, sports fans from all over Punjab as well as outstation States etc.

It was a great moment to see the impressive turn out of Junior and Sub Junior categories of participants.
