India Achieves Success at the 10th Asia Pacific Deaf Games 2024

New Delhi, December 7, 2024: The All India Sports Council of the Deaf (AISCD) is proud to announce that the Indian contingent has achieved remarkable success at the 10th Asia Pacific Deaf Games, which were held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, from December 1 to 8, 2024. Despite facing challenges due to short notice and logistical changes, the Games have concluded successfully, with India ranking 5th out of 23 participating countries and securing a total of 55 medals.

Originally, the 10th Asia Pacific Deaf Games were scheduled to take place in Tehran, Iran, from October 15 to 26, 2024, across 14 different disciplines. However, due to insufficient entries, Iran announced the postponement of the Games on September 17, 2024. On September 23, Malaysia stepped forward and offered to host the Games in Kuala Lumpur, from December 01 to 8, 2024, though the number of disciplines was reduced to nine due to the short timeframe for preparation. The AISCD extends its deepest gratitude to the Malaysian Deaf Sports Association for their commendable risk-taking and successful management of the event in just three months.

The Games were conducted with a simple opening ceremony attended by Malaysia's Minister for Sports, but a closing ceremony was not held. The AISCD commends the efforts made by Malaysia to organize the Games under challenging circumstances, and we acknowledge a minor error in the process that did not affect the overall success.

India's performance at the Games was exceptional, with a total of 55 medals—08 gold, 18 silver, and 29 bronze. The medal tally across various disciplines is as follows:
